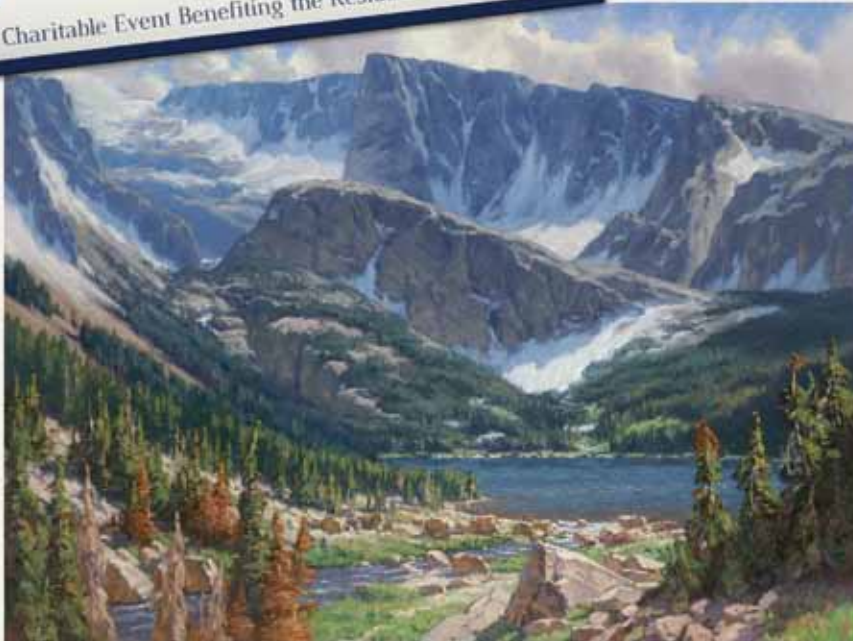

Lutheran Social Services and Wendy's Wonderful Kids are making a difference for thousands of children - one child at a time!



The Dave Thomas Foundation for Adoption launched a groundbreaking initiative called Wendy's Wonderful Kids. This national program awards grants to local adoption agencies to hire recruiters focused exclusively on placing foster care children in loving, adoptive families. Wendy's Wonderful Kids is a gift to both the waiting children of our community and Lutheran Social Services of Montana.

On January 1, 2005 the Foundation first issued a grant to Lutheran Social Services of Montana, and the award has continued for five consecutive years.

Diana Tolstedt, Birthparent/Adoption Caseworker for the Billings area LSS/MT office, is one of the recruiters for Montana. "Every child deserves the love and support that only a family can provide," said Diana. Wendy's Wonderful Kids gives our agency the resources needed to focus on recruiting families for foster care children in our community who have been waiting the longest."

These waiting children are often considered unadoptable because of their age (teenagers), race, physical or

emotional challenges, or need to be placed with siblings. Children who drift in the foster care system or age out of care are victims of broken attachments and are at the greatest risk for maladaptive behavior as adults. Adoption can provide the needed social, emotional, financial and family support required by all young people as they transition to adulthood.

"Most people think of the bad things the kids may do, but they don't think about the kids who just want to have a family," Amy S. said. "Sometimes we get in trouble, but we can really be helpful. But the older kids need someone too, someone to love them, to have a family."

Diana strongly believes that there are potential adoptive parents in the state who have room in their homes and in their hearts. She is ready to do whatever possible to help a waiting child "catch his leprechaun."

"*Joining Hearts In Hope*"...hope that one day a child in foster care, waiting for a "forever family," can finally say, "I'm home, I'm safe, and I'm loved."

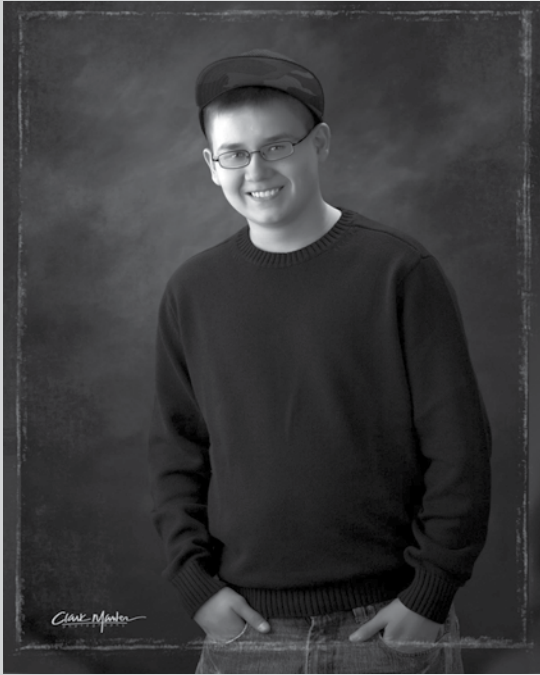

unteer assignment. They begin setting up Hazel's Coffee Cart in the East Entry lobby at St. John's and prepare for many people looking for a cup of morning inspiration. Within a short time, as staff begins to arrive for work, the rich smell of coffee begins to fill the space and the quiet corner near the elevator begins to come alive.

Many staff members look forward to Tuesday mornings for their chance to get a fresh, hot drink (or cold, depending on the season) to take back to their desk or to a meeting, and orders start coming in from all parts of campus.

Laverna and Irwin have become pretty well versed in making lattes, mochas, and chai tea drinks. Laverna uses her years of experience from the lunch rushes at the Dash Inn in Lewistown to keep the coffee cart running as smooth as the quilt shop she owned back home. Irwin, who owned and operated a hardware store for 58 years in Fairview, likes to help set-up, clean-up, and, when it gets really busy, adding the syrups to the cups before Laverna adds the coffee and milk.

They both enjoy the opportunity to meet and get to know the staff. Laverna says, "St. John's is a great place to live, and I hope that what I do makes other people as happy as it makes me."



ST. JOHN'S TWO NEW EXPANSION PROJECTS TAKE SHAPE



The Willows in Red Lodge and WyndStone in the Heights Begin

Construction has started in Red Lodge on The Willows, a 24-bedroom assisted living cottage. A partnership with the Billings Clinic and Beartooth Hospital, the cottage will be located on land immediately south of the new hospital in Red Lodge on Highway 212.

The Willows is a new design, a “duplex cottage,” similar to the current cottages on the Billings campus...it is two cottages connected together sharing common staff areas such as kitchen, storage, and utilities. The resident living areas and bedrooms will continue to remain separate and distinct. There will be two separate entrances, and the residents and families will not know they are connected to another cottage from the inside. The connected common areas will make it easier for the staff to serve the elders, eliminate duplication of services, and the staff will avoid having to walk outside between during the Red Lodge winter months.

Messiah Lutheran Church of Red Lodge, one of the St. John's ownership congregations, affirmed an invitation by Beartooth Hospital for St. John's to build a new retirement community in Red Lodge. Many congregation members, as well as Pr. Kim Wilker, attended a Foundation Blessing, held on October 14th on a beautiful fall day. About 50 people were on hand to bless the facility and shovel concrete into a ceremonial footing.

The Willows is scheduled to open in the fall of 2011.

Presales have started for WyndStone, a new retirement community in the Billings Heights. WyndStone is an independent living community for active adults to retire well located near Skyview High School and Harvest Church.

WyndStone is a partnership with Atonement Lutheran Church. Atonement donated the acreage to build the retirement community, and they plan to one day build a new church on this site.

This is also the site of the “Little White Church”...the Faith Lutheran Church building that was moved from Box Elder to Billings in 2006. The basement of the Little White Church will serve as the marketing office for WyndStone. Once the project is completed, the church will also serve as the chapel for the community.

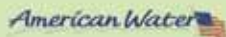
